

# KNOW THE DIFFERENCE There / Their / They're

### There

(adverb / introductory word): used to indicate a place or to introduce a sentence when the main subject comes later.

The books are over **there**. (place) **There** is a new student in class. (introducing a sentence)

## Their

(possessive adjective): shows that something belongs to a person or group.

The students forgot **their** books in the classroom.

# They're

(contraction): short for "they are".

**They're** excited about the party tonight

#### **HOW TO REMEMBER**

**There** = spelled like "here"

→ both refer to location

**Their** = ownership

They're = "they are"
