



# KNOW THE DIFFERENCE

## There / Their / They're

### There

*(adverb / introductory word)*: used to indicate a place or to introduce a sentence when the main subject comes later.

-----  
The books are over **there**. *(place)*

**There** is a new student in class. *(introducing a sentence)*

### Their

*(possessive adjective)*: shows that something belongs to a person or group.

-----  
The students forgot **their** books in the classroom.

### They're

*(contraction)*: short for "they are".

-----  
**They're** excited about the party tonight

## HOW TO REMEMBER

**There** = spelled like "here"  
→ both refer to location

**Their** = ownership

**They're** = "they are"
